## Overview and Setup:

We encourage everyone in our community to get comfortable using "Church Center," which you can access as an app on your smartphone, or through an internet browser. Follow the steps below to get set up (if you haven't already) and then learn how the "Groups" feature will allow you to stay connected with your Sunday School class and any other adult studies.






For our purposes, direct your attention to "Adult Sunday School" and "Unique Groups."






# Utilizing Church Center for Adult Formation Using for Sunday School:

- Add Leaders. Each class can select multiple leaders who will be granted the administrative privileges listed below.
- Track Attendance. Every Sunday morning, class leaders are sent reminders to take attendance for their class. A roster will automatically appear with members names, and you simply check who is present. Tracking attendance allows us to take note of trends, and helps draw our attention to certain needs (changes in room assignments, checking up on those who have been regularly absent, etc.)
- Check Announcements. Every week, Pastor Madison will post announcements under the "Resources" tab. These will be available to every member of the group, and you will receive a printed copy in your class folder. Please make it a priority to take a few moments at the start or end of each class to read these off.
- Utilize Calendar. If your group plans any events outside of the Sunday School hour, you can add them to your own group calendar, which will send members notifications and reminders! You can also collect RSVPs. Examples of group events might include lunch plans after worship, holiday parties or birthday celebrations, service projects, etc.
- Contact Members. Group leaders can easily send emails and messages to members without having to leave the app!






# Utilizing Church Center for Adult Formation Using for Adult Studies:

Anytime we announce a new Adult Study, you will be able to find it on Church Center under "Unique Groups" and Request to Join.

This will make it easier for Group Leaders to:

- get a sense of who plans to show up
- send along door codes for building entry
- track attendance
- share notes and resources
- send reminders about readings or suggested prep work
- inform participants if group session needs to be cancelled or moved online for any reason


This will also allow members easy access to:




#### Tuesday Study with Pastor Kay

The birth of Christ we celebrate at Advent and Christmas offers us hope, but that hope can often get lost in the messiness of life — our busyness, worry, and discouragement.






#### <u>Sunday Study with Pastor Madison</u>






#### Lenten Study with Pastor Kay

Each Gospel offers a different lens through which we understand Jesus' Passion. One portrait reveals Jesus to be in control, while another emphasizes his suffering. In one story Jesus offers hope to the thief on the cross, and in another Jesus only receives derision. These different perspectives aren't a reason to dismiss the Gospels; rather the reveal an abundant, diverse, and complementary picture of God's work in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.




#### Lenten Study with Loni Fancher







## Spend Sunday School in Lent with Me!

All are welcome to join me for Sunday School during Lent! I will be in the Great Hall teaching a series of lessons called **The Body and the Blood** on how we as United Methodists narrate the story of the cross. See below for a list of the topics I will be covering, and <u>look forward to being joined on April 6 by Rev. Dr. Natalya Cherry from Brite Divinity School</u>!

Session One: What Did the Cross Accomplish? - An Overview of Atonement Theologies and John Wesley's Interpretation

Session Two: Did Jesus Really Have to Die? - Notions of Sin, Salvation, and the Necessity of Violence

Session Three: What Does The Cross Symbolize? - Notions of Terror, Trauma, and the Glorification of Suffering

Session Four: What is *My* Cross to Bear? - Notions of Guilt, Shame, Love, and Self-Sacrifice

Session Five: Were You There? - A New Way of Experiencing Holy Week and Seeing Yourself in the Story

If your class decides to schedule a lesson with a teacher, a representative may contact them personally to check their availability and discuss materials for presentation.


